

# Latest meeting

The latest meeting of the Redditch Local History Society was held on Monday 15th May 2019 at the Oasis Christian Centre, Plymouth Road

For the meeting we had an attendance of 46 members and 6 visitors, giving a total of 52 attendees. We had 3 new members joining at the meeting.

The meeting began with an introduction by the Chairman who welcomed members and visitors, read the Society notices and introduced the speaker.



For today's talk, Vanessa Morgan told the story 'Nineteenth Century Rogues and Murderers in Worcestershire' whereby, using contemporary newspaper articles and census data, she related a series of stories on a variety of crimes, some serious and others not so serious..

The talk included many stories including the story of Joshua Hollis who, in 1832, after a day spent drinking with friends ended up dead, Charles Bollis (alias Smith), who stole some items of Redditch Railway Station and was given 15 months hard labour, and an habitual offender, James Heath of Redditch – a fish hook maker, who between the 1840s and 1870s he was up before the magistrates for many offences e.g. poaching/threatening behaviour/drunkenness and sent to prison many times.

Vanessa concluded her talk by describing how the law changed concerning hangings. From hangings that took place near the scene of the crime witnessed by thousands of people, to taking place outside the main prisons such as Worcester and Warwick. In 1868 the law changed and until 1902, hangings took place inside the prison with reporters present and a black flag raised to show it was happening. For horrendous crimes the body was taken down and sent for dissection by medical students.

The talk was well received by the audience and there were a number of questions.

The talk was followed by tea/coffee and biscuits in the adjoining room.




# Next meeting


Our next Meeting at the Oasis Christian Centre is on Monday 10th June and is entitled 'Remembering Redditch'.
